At Junior Sports day earlier, this week everyone showed amazing sporting attitudes. Well done to all of our pupils who took part with such great enthusiasm, house colours made this a spectacular colourful sporting event.

Our golf team represented Etonbury on Wednesday, playing 18 holes at Woodhall Spa, Lincolnshire, representing Bedfordshire in the National Golf Event. They came 2nd place! This is an amazing achievement. It started with 580 schools (1780 students) across England and finished today with 27 schools (81 students).Congratulations to our golfers pictured left.





We are proud to partner with the Brilliant Club, a charity that introduces students to university-style learning with a PhD tutor. This year's cohort have studied literary theory and all passed their final assignments with the equivalent of a 2:1 and above, which is a fantastic achievement. Last Thursday they went to Nottingham University for their graduation and to learn more about life at a Russell Group university. They were very impressed with the university campus and what life as a university student could consist of. This year we have been able, once

again, to offer DNA Gel electrophoresis biotechnology sessions to some of our students. This gives our students hands-on practical experience and a chance to use cutting-edge equipment that is now commonplace in research and industry. 




The Year 12s will be selling off their stock of ice pops at juniors and secondary break all week to raise funds for the USA trip. A pound a pop.

GCSE Results Day

This year, GCSE results day will be held on Thursday the 22nd of August. Students can arrive between 8:30 and 11am to collect their results. Please enter the school via the new reception and collect results from the new sixth form block. Parents are able to wait for students in the sixth form garden.

Students will be asked to sign for their results and sign consent for their scripts. Exam scripts are gained for departments to use as teaching and learning professional development as well as to help advise on reviews of marking.

If students cannot come into school to collect their results, the following may be arranged:

• A nominated person can collect them on your behalf but they must have a letter of authorisation <u>from the student</u>. To authorise this please email our exams officer Mrs Williams at: <u>gwilliams@bestacademies.org.uk</u>. Please note that this nominated person may be asked for a photographic ID before results are given out.

• Results can be posted home but you must supply a stamped self-addressed envelope to the exams office no later than 17th July 2024.

• A PDF of results can be emailed to the students' school email address, which will be emailed by midday, this must be requested by the student no later than 17th July 2024.

If you have applied to Etonbury Sixth Form, you will receive a letter in your results pack, informing you of your acceptance, or if a discussion is required with Mrs Dowden. You will also need to confirm or decline your place in the Sixth Form by completing the slip and returning it to us before you leave. If you need an appointment with Mrs Dowden because you would like to discuss/change your options, you will be able to book these on the day once you have collected your results. These will take place in the afternoon from 12pm.
